He has an interdisciplinary background in marine affairs and marine environmental science and career experience in the areas of oceans policy research, marine affairs project management, fisheries development, environmental assessment, and shellfish aquaculture development, management, and research.

Dr. Moira L. McConnell is the Director of the Marine & Environmental Law Institute at Dalhousie Law School and has been a member of the Faculty since January 1989. Professor McConnell is currently a special advisor to the Director of International Standards, ILO, assisting with the development of a consolidated maritime labour convention (2006).
