

STUDENT FINANCE COMMITTEE: 2009-2010 GENERAL REPORT

Introduction

The Student Finance Committee (SFC) is a Faculty Council Committee comprised of both Faculty and Student members. The SFC is the Committee responsible for overseeing the Law School's Bursary and Scholarship Programme and for administering a portion of the award and financial support monies available to Dalhousie University's Schulich School of Law students registered in any one of their three years of study towards an LL.B. degree. The SFC is not responsible for the administration or distribution of monies which fall under the mandates of other Faculty Council Committees.¹

Composition

The SFC for the 2009-10 academic year was comprised of Co-Chairs Professor David Blaikie and Donna Beaver (Director of Finance & Administration) along with one faculty member, Professor Carol Aylward

The student members of the SFC were chosen through the Law Students' Society (LSS). Each year of LL.B. study was represented by two student members. The student members for 2009-2010 were: Andre Cain, Dustin Griffin, (first year); Richard Norman, Jonathan Pendrith (second year); Jacqueline Porter, Catherine Hoogendoorn (third year).

Once again this year, the involvement of all student committee members has been of central assistance to the Committee's work. The student members of the SFC are integral to both the efficiency and fairness of the Committee's processes. Each student contributes a tremendous amount of time and effort. Their vigilance in considering and reviewing a great deal of information, while maintaining respect for student confidentiality and privacy, adds considerably to the quality of the Committee's work.

The secretary to the SFC is Mrs. Tiffany Coolen-Jewers, Administrative Assistant to the Director of Finance & Administration. Ms. Coolen-Jewers handles all the administrative tasks regarding the distribution of forms and information. She is also responsible for uploading all the individual student data; double-checking for accuracy and currency; following-up with students re missing information; and coordinating with Student

Accounts and Financial Records regarding requisitions of cheques and notification of students.

Summary of Awards for 2009-2010

The SFC draws its bursaries and scholarship monies from three sources: The University's Account (which in 2009-2010 totaled **\$293,200**); the Law School's own Account (comprised of monies from the Auxiliary Fees, which totaled **\$352,610** in 2009-2010); and monies donated or endowed through individually Named Awards, Bursaries and Scholarships (which totaled **\$102,488** in 2009-2010), plus an additional **\$16,000** comprised of donations from Law School Alumni who give annually to the Law School Bursary Fund. Consequently, the Student Finance Committee began the year with a total of **\$764,298** in monies to distribute in 2009-2010. The Table below is the final summary of all the awards distributed by the SFC from all categories during the 2009-2010 academic year.
