The J. William E. Mingo Memorial Scholarship For International Study

The **J. William E. Mingo Memorial Scholarship** is a one year scholarship of at least \$25,000 awarded annually to a student or graduate of Dalhousie Law School for graduate legal education outside of Canada. The scholarship was awarded for the first time in the spring of 2007.

The Mingo Memorial Scholarship is the result of generous gifts made to Dalhousie Law School by close friends and business associates of the late William Mingo (1926-2005) in honor of his distinguished career and many and varied accomplishments and contributions to the community and to the world of business. Mr. Mingo graduated from Dalhousie Law School as the Gold Medalist in 1946 and went on to complete a Masters of Law Degree at Columbia University. He was called to the Bar in Nova Scotia in 1950 and practiced law at Stewart McKelvey Stirling Scales and its predecessor firms from 1950 to 2005, first as a litigator, and later in the fields of corporate and commercial law. Mr. Mingo was instrumental in the establishment of the Law Foundation of Nova Scotia and was nationally recognized as one of the founders of Legal Aid in Nova Scotia. He received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Dalhousie University in 1998, was appointed to the Order of Canada in 2004, and was inducted into the Nova Scotia Business Hall of Fame in 2005. He was a loyal and generous supporter of Dalhousie Law School.

Eligibility

In order to be eligible for the Mingo Memorial scholarship an applicant must:

- (a) have graduated from Dalhousie Law School with an LL.B. not more than three years prior to making application for the scholarship, or be in their final year of the LL.B. program at and about to graduate from Dalhousie Law School; and
- (b) plan to pursue graduate studies in law at an institution of their choice outside of Canada in a program that commences within twelve months of the application deadline for the scholarship.

Selection Criteria

The scholarship will be awarded by the selection committee on the basis of academic excellence, demonstrated leadership ability, outstanding qualities of character, and the quality of the proposed program of study. The selection committee may also take financial need into consideration. The committee may invite shortlisted candidates to be interviewed.

Information To Be Provided By Applicants

Applicants must submit the following information to the selection committee:

- (a) a completed application form outlining in detail the nature and purpose of their proposed program of study, including the names of the universities to which they have applied or intend to apply;
- (b) official transcripts from all universities they have attended for undergraduate and graduate study, as well as their official transcript from Dalhousie Law School;
- (c) three letters of reference, two of which must be from academic referees; and
- (d) an up-to-date resume.

If an applicant wishes the committee to consider his or her financial need, then the applicant should also provide the committee with information as to his or her financial situation.

Application forms are available in the Office of the Dean, Dalhousie Law School.

Other Terms

The scholarship is non-renewable. The scholarship funds will be disbursed to the successful applicant in two equal installments, one installment at the beginning of each term upon receipt by Dalhousie Law School of proof of registration of the recipient in the program of study outlined in, and at one of the universities identified in, the recipient's initial scholarship application.
