

Professor Richard Devlin delivers the *J. Donald Mawhinney Lectures in Professional Ethics* at the University of British Columbia.

The J. Donald Mawhinney lectures were established in 2006 to “provide a forum for the discussion of the legal profession and legal ethics in Canada”. Two lectures are delivered each year, one for the bench, bar and general public in downtown Vancouver, the other at the University for students and faculty members. Previous lectures were delivered by McLachlin C. J.C., Binnie J., Professor Christine Parker (Melbourne) and Professor David Wilkins (Harvard).

Professor Devlin’s first lecture addressed the theme of the *Self Regulation of the Legal Profession* and the second focused on constructing a *Role Morality for Trial Level Judges*.
